Victor Conde, a prolific and multifaceted author, has published more than fifty books and received several prestigious awards in the sci-fi genre. In 2010, he won the Minotauro Prize with Chronicles of the Multiverse, for which he has also been a finalist on two occasions: in 2004 with Mystes, and in 2005 with The Secret Theatre. He has also published the novels The Emperor's Third Name, Star Dragon, Still Life, and Daughter of Wolves. In 2022, he once again won the Minotauro Prize together with Guillem Sánchez for their science fiction work entitled Horizon of Stars.

uillem Sánchez i Gómez is a science fiction writer, essayist, novelist, and short-story writer. His work consists of more than ten novels and short stories for which he has won prizes such as the Ignotus Award, the Jules Verne Award and the Alberto Magno Award. His style is characterised by a great sense of humour, sometimes overt, sometimes subtle. Through wonder and fantasy, he fuses the most epic deeds with everyday life.

VÍCTOR CONDE & GUILLEM SÁNCHEZ

HORIZON OF STARS

A haunting epic that fuses the fast rhythm of space operas with the eerie atmosphere of haunted house mysteries

Soleyko is an engineer who has decided to leave behind her partner and her life on Earth to embark on a colonising mission on a ship with 200,000 other people. The ship has embarked on this expedition with the Idor, an alien race that cooperates with humans despite all the differences that separate them, from the most obvious, such as anatomical, to the most profound, such as their ability to fictionalise: the Idor's world is divided between certainties and uncertainties.

Mid-journey, and light years away from reaching her final destination, Soleyko wakes up in her hibernation pod earlier than expected. The ship seems to have veered off course and, to make matters worse, the other passengers dozing in the adjacent pods are beginning to show mutations in their DNA; mutations that could have irrevocable consequences and jeopardise the colonisation expedition. A huge unidentified ship appears alongside them in space. All indications point to the fact that it is manned by the Ker, a highly intelligent civilisation with which they have had no previous contact.

Realising that this unexpected appearance and the alterations in the travellers' DNA could be linked, Soleyko and the higher-ups launch an operation to enter the ship and unravel these mysterious events.

n the year 2560, humanity has managed to expand to 8,000 planets thanks to anagravonic motors that allow interspace-exspace leaps. Captain Florence Schiaparelli, known in the Federal Fleet as Florence Halflife, along with the crew of the Banshee, is on a mission to obtain all the data possible about a black hole that she herself has christened The Eye of God.

Suddendly, they detect an unidentified and mysterious ship trapped near the event horizon of the wormhole. It seems impossible, but they discover it is a spaceship which disappeared thousands of years ago: the Necromancer, leaded by the fearless Captain Ursa Krasnaia.

Between thriller and science fiction, Pablo Tébar describes a devastating future that is scarily close to home

"Welcome to Mars." This is the first thing León Miranda, an expert in dead languages, hears when he lands on the Red Planet, now in the process of colonisation. He had to leave his wife and son behind for a mysterious job about which he has not been given much information. Only upon arriving does he discover his task: he must translate a stone mural full of inscriptions in the language of an ancient civilisation, a stone mural that is suspected to contain the answer to an ancestral mystery.

Meanwhile, on the slowly dying Earth, the days are numbered. Human beings have squeezed resources to the point of exhaustion, and desertification and pandemics are unstoppable. The planet has been divided into two zones by a miles-long fence. In the prosperous region in which the well-to-do people live, a serial killer known as the Undertaker enforces justice at his discretion. Given the lack of clues surrounding these events, the military police officer Lora Walters faces an investigation against the clock to unmask this elusive subject.

On the other side of the wall, in the area ravaged by natural disasters and to which the zombies (sick, delinquent people without resources) are banished, the drug trafficker Félix and the little orphan Nunu take advantage of the fact that a section of the wall has been knocked down. The evacuation to Mars is imminent, but only those who are in the prosperous region will get the authorisation to emigrate.





n these eight tales, writer Ariadna Castellarnau enters the realm of fantasy to explore the strange and shadowy side of human relationships. A girl who takes refuge in the forest, running from her family, meets a feral teenager; two brothers, one of whose deformity turns him into an object of fascination, compete for the attention of their absent parents; a man who must leave a girl at a brothel will establish with her a bond for eternity; a couple on an island tries to find meaning in their life while they decide what to do with a mysterious baby that has appeared in front of their door; a girl hopes in vain to satisfy the expectations of her father by learning his profession.

These short stories are intense, mesmerizing and open ended, its characters move in an uncertain, twisting terrain.

It just so happens that the sky is blustery, and Andrés Bouza runs aground. He is forced to take shelter from the storm in a creepy inn. There he hears the stories of a blind priest who listens to the pulse of the world's enigmas, of God and of the devil, and learns the fates of Chiruca, Zopo, and other petty criminals linked only by the sentence of the sea. There will be threats, hunts, betrayals, sex, violence, drug caches, revenge, greed, intrigues, crimes, mysteries and also love, heartbreak and nostalgia. Mermaid Flesh is the story of how Andrés Bouza arrived to the last day of his life.

In a very polished style, Glez again employs the best elements of the crime novel: there are mysteries, unexpected twists and stories that are intertwined to the very end.




